

Biteslide: An Online Scrapbook


Biteslide is a great tool for students to use to evaluate and synthesize the information they have learned. This lesson is geared toward sixth grade ELA teachers letting students use their independent reading to discuss different types of conflict and complete a plot analysis. Students can use text, videos, and pictures to create a digital project that will be engaging for students and teachers.

ELACC6RL1: Cite textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.

ELACC6RL2: Determine a theme or central idea of a text and how it is conveyed through particular details; provide a summary of the text distinct from personal opinions or judgments.

ELACC6RL3: Describe how a particular story's or drama's plot unfolds in a series of episodes as well as how the characters respond or change as the plot moves towards a resolution

Setting Up Your Account (The free version of Biteslide allows one project at a time with a max of 30 students. If you can't pay, you can set up a free email accounts and create multiple Biteslide accounts.)



1. Go to www.biteslide.com.
2. Click the arrow next to Register.
3. Click on Teacher.







In the purple box titled Your Classes, click Add



1. Double click in the banner to add a class name and description.
2. Click Managa Students to add students to the class.



1. For students that have been added in the past, you can click the check box under their names and click Update to add them to the class.
2. To create new student accounts, click Add a New Student.




Did you know...
 that students can register themselves? Give them a unique class code and they can self register at www.biteslide.com

1. Fill in their information.
2. Click Create.
3. Students can also register themselves with the unique code on your dashboard page.



Once you create a new students, you'll be taken back to the Manage Students page, so you can add them to the class. **Remember: Creating a new student does not automatically add them to you your class.**

1. You'll see them students you've already added highlighted in orange with checks untheir names.
2. Check the new student.
3. Click Update.



1. Once you click Update, you'll be taken to the class page and see the students in the class.
2. You can hover over a student and have the option to edit and delete them.
3. You'll also see the registration code students can use to make their own accounts.
4. You can open or close that option to students as you need.
5. Now that your class is set, let's create your first project by clicking Add Project.

Creating a Project



1. Double click in the banner to add a project title and description.
2. You can change the project from published to unpublished, if you're not ready for students to see it.
3. You can also change the project settings.

The project setting page lets you decide where students can get graphics and videos, make comments, and if they can embed their biteslides into other websites.





2. Click Save.
3. After clicking Save, you'll be taken back to the Project page. Click Add Slidebook to make your own as an example.


Creating Your Slidebook



1. Choose a style for your slidebook. I usually choose scrapbook.
2. Click Next.



1. From this page, you can choose a Youtube video, a Google Image, or a file you upload (Your Bites) to add to the cover of your scrapbook. You can add more than one.
2. Search for what you want.
3. Drag the image or video into the window to the right.
4. Click Next.



If you need additional help with your first slidebook, you can choose to go through this tutorial or click Finish to move ahead.




In the editing mode, you have four areas to work with.

1. The window on the left side allows you to add pictures, videos, files, change page backgrounds, and picture borders.
2. Choose what you like and drag it to the page.



The window at the top allows you to

1. change your title,
2. add editors,
3. and close your scrapbook.



The actual scrapbook page is where you will create your project.

1. Add and change text. (Once you add text click off and then back on the text box and make it bigger to make the text bigger.)

2. Resize and move pictures.
3. Change the background color of the page.
4. Download the scrapbook to your computer as a picture file.
5. Print your scrapbook.



The bottom window allows you to

1. add slides (pages)
2. navigate between slides
3. look at the scrapbook in Fullscreen.

The scrapbook automatically saves as you go along, but if it freezes, refresh your page, choose stay on page, then click cancel.
